

JJD Change Log

Updates to JJD are periodically posted for download on the web. JJD checks for available updates each time it is started and will offer to install the new version for you. This means you should always be up-to-date with the latest and greatest from Equusentials.

Current Version

The current release of JJD is version **4.2.0.2** which was released on February 16, 2016.

- A second scoreboard option is now available that does not include the top 3 list at the bottom of the screen. Hold Ctrl key when clicking **View Scoreboard** button to open the new scoreboard.
- Fixed a bug regarding date/time error when in trial mode.

Previous Versions

Changes in 4.2.0.1 released on Feb. 7, 2016

- Rider name field can be made up of three parts from your entry information file and horse name can be made up of two parts.

Changes in 4.2.0.0 released on Jan. 4, 2016

- All rulebooks have been refreshed with the 2016 versions.

Changes in 4.1.2.11 released on Jan. 1, 2016

- Small change to make sure year value persists across the new year so a show started in 2015 and ending in 2016 will post all results on the web as 2015.

Changes in 4.1.2.8 released on Dec. 20, 2015

- Minor bug fix in scoresheet backup logic.

Changes in 4.1.2.7 released on Nov. 22, 2015

- Made some minor user experience improvements and bug fixes.

Changes in 4.1.2.4 released on Oct. 12, 2015

- Fixed bug in auto-posting of reports after finalizing a class.
- Fixed bug when opening a JJD file from the command line.
- Added chhorse / ch command line option to change horse name

Changes in 4.1.2.2 released on Oct. 7, 2015

- Fixed bug in display of rider name where there was no space shown between first and last name.

Changes in 4.1.2.1 released on Sep. 25, 2015

- Minor change to improve logic to check the internet connection status.

Changes in 4.1.2.0 released on Sep. 20, 2015

- You can now display the fault count for each jump on the **Judge** panel. To turn on and off this option, use the **Display Fault Counts** checkbox on the **Settings** dialog. For example, if three entries knock down a rail at jump 7 and another has a refusal, you will see the number 4 under jump 7 on the **Judge** panel. This information is most useful to the announcer and course designer. The fault count data is also saved to a faultcounts.csv file for each class that the course designer can open in Excel.
- The Stagger Viewer now has an expanded view that shows the horse and rider. You can switch between regular and expanded view with a new button on the title bar, or you can just double-click on the title bar.

Changes in 4.1.1.1 released on Sep. 15, 2015

- A new command line function has been added that lets you add a horse and rider to the current class. Example: **>ad 451 "Jennifer Carson"** (adds entry number 451 with rider Jennifer Carson)
- A new command line function has been added that lets you change the rider for an entry in the current class. Example: **>cr 351 "Bill Smith"** (changes rider for entry 351 to Bill Smith)
- A new command line function has been added that lets you mark an entry as withdrawn from the current class. Example: **>wd 409** (marks entry 409 as withdrawn)
- While entering jump results, you can now use the **Shift+Enter** keystrokes to tab backwards.

- The use of the **Split** function of the built-in timer has been improved for Power & Speed classes.
- Fixed a bug that was causing the class results email content to be cut off in the email window.

Changes in 4.1.0.1 released on Sep. 6, 2015

- Some bug fixes and scoresheet improvements have been implemented for Table III (faults converted) scoring.
- The 45 second clock is now more useful as it can now be used to time the horse & rider between obstacles. The 45 second clock was also moved below the main timer display. **Note:** the 45 second clock can be turned on/off from the Settings screen.

Changes in 4.1.0.0 released on Aug. 31, 2015

- After you finalize a class, you can now email class results to a list of recipients. You maintain a list of email addresses and specify which in the list should receive the class results email. That way, you can keep a master list but only activate those based on the show and/or ring you're working. Think about how helpful it will be to email results to the back gate person. This feature requires internet access from the judge's booth. You can enter "em" at the command line too.
- After you finalize a class, you can also have JJD automatically post the score sheet and/or placings report to the web. You can have the class results email prepared automatically too. This feature also requires internet access from the judge's booth.
- When judging multiple cards, you can now quickly switch between cards in two ways:
 - Click the > button under the back button to slide out a list of all other instances of JJD, then click on the instance representing the card you want to jump to. Ctrl-F9 is the keyboard shortcut to show the other cards.
 - Use the new switch/sw command line option where you enter the card number you wish to switch to. **Example:** at the command line, enter "sw 3" to switch to card 3.
- You can now paste class specs from a class that you've previously judged. This is handy when you're re-using a course that was used earlier in the show. You can use this new paste option in two ways:
 - Look for the **Paste From ...** button on the **Specs** panel. You will be asked to enter the class number after you click the button.

- Use the new pastefrom/pf command line where you enter the class number you wish to paste from. **Example:** at the command line, enter "pf 114" to paste the specs from class 114.
- The class score sheet is now continuously backed up to the cloud so that if you have a computer failure, any device with internet access will be able to view/print the class score sheet as of your last saved/recorded entry (**requires internet access from the judge's booth**). To try out the recovery process, click [here](#) and enter org "chs" and show "pco" then click the **Show Available Score Sheets** button.

Changes in 4.0.0.6 released on Aug. 10, 2015

- Some minor fixes for the [ShowManagementSystem](#) integration.
- Updates for Australian rules around multiple displacements.
- Added new command line function "score" or "sb" added to open the scoreboard screen.
- When a new version of JJD is installed, user is offered to read about what's new by having this page opened in their browser.
